

LIES IN CHURCH

If you've sat in the pew for any length of time, you've heard some lies. That's right, *lies*. In church. Not so sure about that? Read on!

Steve McVey has identified 52 lies that are commonly taught in churches every Sunday. What qualifies him to judge these as lies? The answer is simple. Steve himself unknowingly taught these lies from the pulpit for many years. In his own words, Steve says, "I taught all these lies myself—before I began to experience a radical paradigm shift as I began to learn more about the meaning of grace."

While pastors who teach these lies may be sincere, and some lies may be more "half-truths" than outright deceptions, Steve believes when it comes to the gospel, "Diluted truth is polluted truth, and polluted truth is no gospel at all."

So, what are these 52 lies? Here are just a few examples....

LIE: "Becoming a Christian means having your sins forgiven" (*Truth:* You are also made alive!)

LIE: "Our sins are under the blood of Jesus" (*Truth:* Far better—they've been taken away!)

LIE: "Salvation is giving your life to Christ." (*Truth:* More importantly, He gives you life!)

Now, with conviction but also humility, Steve examines common misconceptions about Christianity, grace, salvation, prayer and more. Even more importantly, he shares why knowing the truth of God's Word is so much better than anything else.
